5. In order to strengthen the cultural ties between Australia and Malaysia, a Malaysian organisation is sponsoring the publication of suitable Malaysian novels to be studied in Australian schools. To be considered, the novels must showcase Malaysia's cultural interactions with other nations.

You have been asked to write a report for this organisation, in which you recommend two suitable novels to fulfil the purpose. Write your report.

Write a review of two novels, in which you attempt to persuade the film-maker that the novels are suitable to be made into a film related to environmental issues.

Based on two Malaysian novels that you have read, write a speech in which you argue *either* for *or* against the topic.
