## SACE stars to shine at Merit Ceremony

More than 1000 South Australian students will be recognised for achieving subject merits in their South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) at rolling ceremonies held at Government House from today.

Over the next 48 hours, 1120 students will receive certificates for achieving 1337 Stage 2 SACE subject merits in 2023.

Among them is Ellie Foulkes, 17, who achieved six merits for subjects including Mathematical Methods, Physics, and Specialist Mathematics.

The talented musician has been chosen as the SACE Class of 2023 student representative and will deliver a speech to dignitaries, including Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC, Governor of South Australia, and South Australian Premier Peter Malinauskas on February 8 at the final session of the Merit Ceremony.

The final session will recognise 29 students who have achieved three or more merits and 40 awarded <u>Governor of South Australia Commendations for Excellence in SACE</u>.

Premier Malinauskas will present three students with the Tennyson Medal, which recognises the highest result in English Literary Studies in 2023. The students are: Ella Mitlan, Devika Kim Mukherjee and Jasmine Annalise Grether.

The Tennyson Medal is one of the oldest and most prestigious prizes presented by the SACE Board. Records show it is the first time three students will receive the Medal in a single year since it was established in 1900.

The Merit Ceremony will be held over six sessions and is an opportunity for the community to celebrate the individual and collective successes of the SACE Class of 2023.

Merits are presented to students for meritorious achievement in a Stage 2 SACE Board accredited subject. Merit recipients must gain an overall grade of A+ for the subject and demonstrate exceptional achievement in the subject.

The Tennyson Medal was established by Hallam Tennyson in 1900 who donated the sum of £100 to provide medals as an award for achievements in English Literature at the South Australian Public Examinations.

It's an honour to receive the medal – which is steeped in South Australian history – and remarkably, for the first time since records have been kept, the Tennyson Medal will be awarded to three students.
