SACE results get posted to Year 12 students across South Australia today

For 21,914 students across the State, the anxious wait for their South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) results will come to an end tomorrow (18 December).

Students will be able to access their results via the SACE website at www.sace.sa.edu.au from 8.30am.

Envelopes containing SACE results are being loaded into an Australia Post truck today (Wednesday 17 December) for delivery tomorrow (18 December).

Students who have completed one or more Stage 2 (Year 12) subject will receive an envelope containing a Record of Achievement; for those who have completed their SACE, this envelope will also contain their SACE certificate.

Eligible students will also receive a second envelope containing a Tertiary Entrance Statement from the South Australian Tertiary Admissions Centre (SATAC) with information about their TAFE SA Selection Score and Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR).

SACE Board Chief Executive Dr Neil McGoran said receiving SACE results was an important milestone in each student's education.

"Achieving the SACE signals the end of the high school journey for students, but it is also the beginning of a new world of career and study opportunities for our State's young people," Dr McGoran said.

"The SACE is a high quality, internationally-recognised qualification that primes students to successfully live, work and pursue further study pathways in their communities and beyond.

"Students are to be commended for the hard work and commitment they have displayed throughout their studies and schooling careers," he said.

"I extend my thanks to the dedicated teachers who have supported students during this important time, as well as acknowledge their combined efforts with markers, moderators, SACE staff and others who helped prepare Year 12 results.

"It is important to note though that SACE results do not define the student. For those that did not achieve their personal goals, there are always options available," he added.
