What is a vision statement?

The vision statement should be a clear and inspiring description of what the subject aims to achieve in the future. It's like a guiding star—defining aspirations and setting a long-term direction. Think of it as answering the question: "Where do we want to go?" It's meant to be ambitious, motivating, and forward-thinking.

Guiding criteria:

- Makes clear what is unique to the subject
- Reflects the <u>key drivers</u> in the context of that subject
- Is focussed on the essence of the subject
- Future focussed

Vision statement

Biology nurtures learners who are curious about the interconnectedness of the living world and care about their place within it. Through inquiry, students cultivate a deep understanding of how life functions, evolves and interacts. The study of Biology develops critical thinkers who can reflect on their knowledge and apply their understanding ensuring they can contribute positively to current and emerging challenges that impact communities at a local and global level.
