Ask open-ended questions:

- how useful...
- to what extent...
- how accurate...
- why...
- what is the best way to...

Avoid questions that:

- are self-evident
- are too broad
- confirm your preconceptions
- you already know the answer to

researched in
the available
time frame?**

Refine your question.

Consider a specific:

- geographical location
- historical time frame
- theme or content
- purpose
- section of the population

Use the
performance
standards

to test the
potential of
your question

Want to have clear and coherent expression of ideas?

- Writing: Check grammar, punctuation, spelling
- Oral: Practise correct grammar, pronunciation and intonation
- Use language with appropriate complexity and tone for your audience
