SACE results are in the mail

The wait is nearly over for 20,364 Year 12 students anxiously anticipating the arrival of their South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) results in the mail tomorrow.

SACE results envelopes are being loaded into an Australia Post truck at the SACE Board this morning - destined to reach the letterboxes of South Australian students tomorrow (Wednesday 19 December).

Any student who has completed one or more Stage 2 subjects will receive a results envelope.

The envelope will contain their South Australian Certificate of Education – if they have completed all of the SACE requirements – as well as their Record of Achievement and a results information booklet.

Eligible students will receive a second envelope containing their Tertiary Entrance Statement from the South Australian Tertiary Admissions Centre (SATAC) with information about their TAFE SA Selection Score and Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR).

SACE Board Chief Executive Dr Paul Kilvert said receiving SACE results is a milestone in each student's education.

“For many the results envelope is the culmination of their high school learning,” he said.

“SACE students have essential literacy and numeracy skills as well as the research, planning and communication skills that they will need to succeed in a digital and information-rich world.

“These results are available due to the combined efforts of teachers, markers, moderators and SACE Board staff, and I thank all involved for their hard work and commitment.”

Students will also be able to access their SACE results and Tertiary Entrance Statement on the SACE Board website (www.sace.sa.edu.au) from 8am tomorrow.

To do this, students will need their SACE Student Registration Number and Personal Identification Number (PIN). If a student does not know their PIN they can reset it through the SACE website: www.sace.sa.edu.au
