Good evening, parents and guardians.

Tonight's information session focuses on the upcoming class camp. As you know, every year, students in this class participate in a range of experiences off-campus. Next week, every student will be involved in a five-day camp, as scheduled on the school calendar.

The departure time for each group is Monday at 8.15 am and the pick-up time is Friday at 3.30 pm from the school car park.

The camp's primary aim is to provide students with opportunities to develop their skills through various activities in three key areas: self, group, and the environment. What do we mean by this? Well, let me explain.

Self: This challenging program provides students with opportunities to develop their selfesteem, independence, and resilience. They will also learn to take on areas of responsibility, for example, taking part in cooking and cleaning.

Group: This part of the program is group orientated. In the group setting, students will work together to foster core values such as respect, understanding, and acceptance of individual differences. The program will also provide opportunities for students to develop their leadership skills.

Environment: Through the study of sustainability, the camp will aim to develop a lasting relationship with the natural world, and a love of the outdoors. We will encourage students to develop a deeper understanding and respect for Aboriginal people and their deep connection to their country.

During the camp, students will engage in activities such as swimming, snorkelling, and a three-day bushwalk. Appropriate equipment and clothing must be used and worn.

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For snorkelling, students will be provided with a wetsuit, snorkel, and fins. If the conditions are calm, students should be able to see a range of fish, crabs, and different coloured corals. They might even see a rare leafy sea dragon.

A complete clothes and equipment list will be sent to each family via email tonight. It is crucial that the list is followed carefully to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for the students. Importantly, students must bring a good quality waterproof jacket, which will keep them dry in case of rain. Students must also bring a wide-brimmed hat to ensure they avoid sunburn. Baseball caps or visors are not acceptable. Students should also wear long-sleeved, collared shirts and must use sunscreen regularly each day.
