Record 4,050 students from country South Australia complete SACE

Students in country South Australia are top of the class after a record 4,050 completed their South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE).

This year saw 55 more students complete their SACE in 2017, compared to 3,995 in 2016.

A total of 107 merit certificates were awarded to 91 students in country South Australia.

More Aboriginal students across South Australia than ever have completed their SACE. In 2016, 377 Aboriginal students (58 more than in 2016) achieved their SACE, with 157 coming from country areas (44 more than in 2016).

A total of 707 students completed a Certificate III VET qualification while completing their SACE, while 91 students from country South Australia areas completed the SACE and studied at least one Modified subject.

SACE Board of South Australia Acting Chief Executive Jan Raymond hailed the outstanding academic achievements of South Australia's regional SACE students.

"It's a fantastic accomplishment to have another record breaking year of students from country South Australia completing their SACE," Ms Raymond said.

"Their academic achievements today are a culmination of 13 years hard work throughout their schooling.

"I commend the work of schools, school leaders and teachers in rural and regional South Australia who have demonstrated outstanding commitment to each of their students to help them achieve their goal of completing the SACE."

Three country students were also among the 25 named as Governor of South Australia Commendation recipients.

The Governor of South Australia Commendation recognises outstanding achievement in Year 12 subjects and in the qualities young people need for community life, citizenship, and work.
